Marybeth McDonald gave a presentation on the "Impact of Hearing Loss on Mental Health". She related studies indicating the correlation of hearing loss to isolation, need for support, failure to share feelings and general loss of health and well being. She drew out an active discussion from the 50 members in attendance.

She explained how getting help for hearing loss results in better health and less depression and how important support groups like HLAA are to a person with hearing loss.
