
PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

How to Improve Your Enjoyment of Music

Dr. Susan Fulton, an HLAA-Sarasota Board Member, addressed the topic, "How to Improve Your Enjoyment of Music". She explained how hearing aid amplification causes distortion in music and why loud noises affect us through 'loudness recruitment". Dr. Fulton stressed the importance of learning about the musicology of the piece you will hear to make it more understandable. She demonstrated some phone/iPad apps that assist in music discrimination.


